
« HOME » GROUP SHOW FRom May, 23 th until June, 23rd 2003

"Home" evokes the home, but this exhibition has no plans or models of any existing or imaginary buildings. There will be no design propositions, not even a chair for visitors to sit in.

And yet "Home" is a very full exhibition. Here we will recognise all the elements that make up a home, but nothing is like what we have in our own.

Each of the artists here interprets, transgresses and subverts familiar elements and shows us how "utility" and "function" can turn out to have a different face.

The rooms in the house that is constructed here are little concerned with comfort, but propose new ways of living and thinking.

This "Home Sweet Home" is constituted by the working, creative space of each of the artists.
